

Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE – course number 1640-13A) training is accepting registrations for the 2013 schedule of classes. The ARIDE course is a 16 hour advanced course dealing primarily with drugged driving detection. The prerequisites for the course are a minimum of 24 hours previous Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) training and proficiency in the administration of the SFST's.

Applicants must use DOCJT Form 29-1 to register for the following classes:

March 12 – 13 (Pikeville)

March 14 – 15 (Richmond)

May 14 – 15 (Williamsburg)

May 16 – 17 (Somerset)

July 8 – 9 (Richmond)
